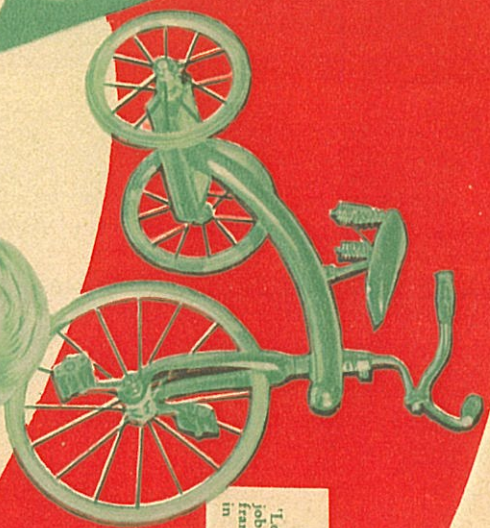


**No. 44—"SNAPPY-BOY" WAGON**
